



And its durability is astonishing

You will enjoy the powerful and safe performance of the 127 Sport, and be astonished by its long life. This has been achieved because the basic design qualities of the 127 are such that the increase in power and performance is possible with minimal strengthening of the mechanical components.

The maximum power output of the 127 Sport is 70 bhp (DIN) at 6500 rpm.

This is the result of a higher compression ratio, modified exhaust manifold, newly-designed camshaft, larger inlet valves, a new air filter and a twin choke carburettor.

Other features include an


independent starter motor control, a larger sump and a lower final drive ratio for improved acceleration (13/58 - 4.5:1 instead of 14/57 - 4.1:1).

The 127 Sport has a top speed of over 160 km/h and covers the standing start km in 35 secs. Fuel consumption is still economical: 15.4 km one litre of petrol at 90 km/h and 11.1 at 120 km/h (9 litres/100 km).

The engine mountings are as on the improved 127 range, which give reduced levels of noise and vibration.

Moreover, the 127 Sport is fitted with a «four into two» exhaust manifold and an Abarth silencer.

Because of the increased engine power, particular attention has been



paid to elements of active safety:


— the braking system is servo-assisted, while the front disc brakes feature one-piece calipers as fitted on the 128 to give greater durability and braking effectiveness;

— the front anti-roll bar has been strengthened and McPherson strut

rear to give improved road-holding and ride comfort;

— wheels with larger rims $(4\frac{1}{2})''$ instead of 4") and high-adhesion radial ply tyres.






